The meeting was attended by the Office bearers of management of Mentee colleges, members of standing committee for PARAMARSH, Principals, and IQAC Coordinators, members of IQAC and Staff members of the mentor and mentee colleges.

1.	Welcome	Dr Mahesh Hedau, IQAC coordinator welcomed the Hon'ble Joint Director Dr Maheshkumar Salunkhe and resource persons Hon'ble Dr Vijay Joshi and Hon'ble Dr P N Pabrekar. He also welcomed all the members present in the meeting.
2.	Welcome speech	Dr M. P. Dhore, Principal of the college delivered the welcome speech. He shared the milestones in the glorious journey of the college since inception and also spoke about the purpose of organization of the meeting.

3.	Opening Remarks	<p>Hon'ble Dr. Maheshkumar Salunkhe Joint Director, Nagpur Region, Nagpur briefed about the government's strategy about quality initiative. He gave a detailed statistics of the status of NAAC accreditation of HEIs in the Nagpur region. He has given detail information about academic institutes available on Grant basis, No-Grant basis, Govt. colleges and Universities and their status of accreditation by NAAC. He also mentioned that government is keen to encourage and promote the HEIs to undergo NAAC assessment. Dr. Salunkhe said that Quality education is the top priority of the Govt.</p> <p>He also spoke about the initiatives of Ministry of HRD for the Quality education like SWAYAM, UGC MOOCs, ePG-PATHSHALA, SWAYAMPURABHA, PARAMARSH etc. PARAMARSH is one of the programmes that which help improve the quality of education of mentee colleges under the guidance of Mentor College. Mentor College should cooperate the Mentee College while writing SSR. They should provide the information about Criterion, key indicators, qualitative matrix and quantitative matrix. At last he said that the Paramarsh scheme will be a great help to the mentee colleges to undergo NAAC assessment.</p>

The mentee colleges expressed their willingness and desire to go for NAAC accreditation under the guidance of mentor college. Dr Dongre and Dr. khobragade from P.M.B.S. College, Nagpur, Dr Rahul Bhagat from Atlanta College, Nagpur, Dr Prashant Jambhulkar from Renaissance college, Nagpur and Dr Nandagavli from Sant Gajanan Maharaj College, Girad shared their views during the interaction.</p>

6.	Remarks by Dr. Vijay Joshi	<p>At the beginning Dr. Joshi sir congratulated Dr. Maheshkumar Salunkhe, Joint Director for the govt. initiatives and scheduling of the Paramarsh meeting. He reiterated that Science College, Nagpur is one of the premier institute in this region and the college is one of the mentor college selected by UGC under PARAMARSH scheme.</p> <p>He said that for quality enhancement of HEIs, NAAC accreditation is must. For this, aided colleges should take the guardianship of un-aided colleges.</p> <p>In his speech he has explained the importance of website and every college should keep the website updated. He also emphasized on the documentation of the activities carried out in colleges. The digitized and classified documentation should be kept ready.</p> <p>Dr. Joshi suggested that the Mentor College should properly plan and design a time bound programme for mentee colleges and accordingly should work for the completion of the task. The scheme of paramarsh should be considered as a time bound target project and should be executed accordingly.</p> <p>He also expressed his dis-satisfaction as regards to the progress of the scheme. He said that the progress is slow, it should gear up and he was confident that mentor college will do the same</p>
